- 2. Declarations of Interest:** There were no declarations of interest.
- 3. Minutes of the last meeting:** The minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on Thursday 14th May 2026 were unanimously confirmed and adopted.

4. Questions/comments from members of the public:

Henry Wilson (HW) provided an update on the website revamp. The new site should be launched in 2 weeks time. HW will have access to the old website as archive. Significant events such as the Queen's Jubilee will transfer to the new site, others will be held in archive.

Pat Glover (PG) of East Garston Eco Group (EGEG) reported that the WBC Community Climate Forum on 3rd June had a presentation about WBC's Environment Strategy Annual Report. PG and Hungerford Environmental Action Team have a meeting planned with WBC about their proposed use of solar generation to offset their operational carbon emissions.

WBC promoted the Switch Together scheme for solar panels and batteries. The deadline for registration is 24 July. There was a discussion on the need for planning permission for solar panels. <https://www.westberks.gov.uk/switch-together>.

The WBC Community Climate Forum on 8th July had a presentation on [Carbon Literacy](#) by PG.

PG asked if the PC would show the Public Emergency Briefing film. SR agreed to co-facilitate a screening later in the summer, and offered to approach the EG Film Society to see if they may be interested in this.

Chairman's Report: SR reported that most of his updates have been covered by Cllr Hooker. He raised the issue of the temporary bus routes in place, the council discussed the potential disruption to school bus service. SR will arrange a working party to remove nettles in Jubilee Meadow ahead of the Village Fete.

Clerk's Report: Emergency Plan has been updated. Flood Policy from 2015 has been partially updated, Clerk asked HR to provide his expertise with this. Two new bus shelters have been requested through the WBC bus shelter grant, the next step is to liaise with contractors for assessment/quotation – Clerk has notified WBC of the potential difficulty caused by current Thames Water works on the Newbury Road and is awaiting response. PJS have provided a quotation for repairs to the Memorial Railings. An alternative provider has been found for playground rubber chippings.

- 8. West Berkshire Local Plan:** The PC discussed the West Berkshire Local Plan, which is under review, along with a potential EG Local Plan.

- 9. Thames Water Pipe Replacement Work:** This was discussed with Cllr Hooker earlier in the meeting.

- 10. Jubilee Meadow & Playground:** Caloo have informed the PC that it is no longer possible to source replacement items for the gym equipment in Jubilee Meadow and as such Caloo are no longer able to service this equipment. PC discussed options for future management of the gym equipment. It was noted that the original purchase of the gym equipment did not come from the Precept.

Action: Clerk to request for a survey in EGN to assess villagers' thoughts on maintaining the gym equipment

- 11. Village Maintenance & Millenium Field:** The Millenium Field seems to have recovered from the Thames Water works and the damaged strip is now being cut with the rest of the field. It was agreed that the compensation money would be utilised for other projects – potentially to help cover cost of repair to Memorial Railings.

- 12. Any other business:** ST reported that she has been notified of a tree on Humphrey's Lane which is in a perilous condition. This falls under Sovereign Housing's jurisdiction.

Action: ST to pass on this information to the person concerned.
